

PRA Follow-Up Procedures Power of Attorney for a Family with children under 18 years old.

Introduction

This Power of Attorney appoints a person (attorney in fact) who lives in downtown San Jose, Costa Rica to transact business and execute documents on your spouse's, your children's (under 18 years old), and your behalf on all your family permanent residency matters at any Costa Rican government institution to obtain your permanent resident status for each of your family members in Costa Rica.

It also authorizes your attorney in fact to draft/cancel/edit a new power of attorney – if necessary – for another person – other than himself/herself - to transact business and execute documents in all acts, bureaucratic procedures at any Costa Rican government institution with the specific purpose of obtaining your permanent resident status in Costa Rica.

Note: An attorney in fact is a person you appoint with the power of attorney. He or she is legally designated to transact business and execute documents on your behalf. He or she may be a friend, a relative, a lawyer, or whoever you want him/her to be, and may practice any type of profession.

If you want to have two attorneys in fact, please print this power of attorney twice, and fill it out with the appropriate information.

This power of attorney is accepted at any Consulate of Costa Rica in the world. If you find an objection stated by a Consul of Costa Rica, please send us the location of the Consulate of Costa Rica, the name and phone number of the person you spoke to, and the reason why he/she objects to accept it. Please forward that information to objections@costarica.com. Once we receive your feedback, our legal departments will contact the Consul to resolve any issues.

Please sign this power of attorney before the Consul of Costa Rica who receives your permanent residence application.

Below you will find the instructions to fill out the power of attorney in Spanish printed on page 5. The power of attorney in Spanish contains fields labeled and numbered in English so that you know what type of information to input in each field. Each numbered field refers to specific instructions on this form. We have also included a certified translation of the power of attorney so that you understand what you are signing.

Instructions

You must submit the power of attorney in SPANISH and sign it before a Consul of Costa Rica at your nearest Consulate of Costa Rica. You must fill in the blanks with the required information in Spanish. Below you will find some translation tables to help you complete the power of attorney.

- 1) Your Complete Name: Write your complete name as follows:

First name Middle Name Last Name. For example, Mary Patricia Smith.

- 2) Your Spouse Complete Name: Write your spouse complete name as follows:

First name Middle Name Last Name. For example, Jeffrey Paul Smith.

- 3) Your Profession: Look in a English-Spanish dictionary the word that best describes your profession.

- 4) Your Spouse Profession: Look in a English-Spanish dictionary the word that best describes your spouse profession.

- 5) Your current home address: Write your current home address as you write it in English.

Example: 750 Bush Street, # A, San Francisco, California 94109

- 6) Your Nationality: Write your nationality according to the table below.

- 7) Your Spouse Nationality: Write your nationality according to the table below

- 8) Your Passport Number: Write your passport number as it appears in your passport.

- 9) Your Spouse Passport Number: Write your spouse passport number as it appears in his/her passport.
- 10) Your attorney in fact complete name: Write his name as it appears on his/her Costa Rican ID or his Costa Rican permanent resident card. The format is: Name Middle Name First Last name Second last name – if any. For example, Roger Antonio Rodriguez Quiroz
- 11) Your Attorney in fact's Marital Status: Write your attorney in fact's marital status in Spanish:

- 12) Your Attorney In Fact's Profession: Look in a English-Spanish dictionary the word that best describes your attorney in fact's profession.
- 13) Your Attorney In Fact's address: Write your attorney in fact's address as he or she tells you to write it. It must be located in downtown San Jose.
- 14) Your Attorney In Fact's address: This field is just in case you need additional space.
- 15) Your Attorney In Fact's telephone number: Write the number without the Costa Rican area code and with the following format: ###-##-##.
- For example, 655-02-35.
- 16) Your attorney in fact's telephone fax: Please write the number without area code and with the following format: ###-##-##. For example, 333-77-22
- 17) Your attorney in fact's Costa Rican Identification number: Write your attorney's in fact's Costa Rican Identification Number.

- 18) City: Write the name of the city where you sign this power of attorney
- 19) Time: Write the time in military format – do not include seconds - that you sign this power of attorney.

For example, if you signed the power of attorney at 2 PM, you must write: 14:00
If you sign the power of attorney at 2:33 PM, you must write: 14:33

- 20) Date: Write the date when you sign the power of attorney in the following format: Number of the day/number of the month/year.

For example, 02/07/2003

- 21) Your Signature: Please sign this power of attorney before a Costa Rican Consul.
- 22) Your Spouse's Signature: Please sign this power of attorney before a Costa Rican Consul
- 23) Autentication del Consul: This space is for the Consul of Costa Rica's authentication signatures and stamps. Please do not write anything on this field.
